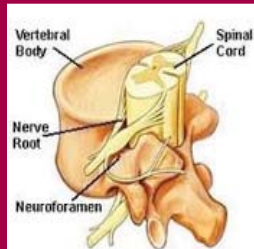

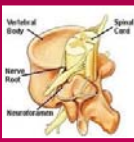

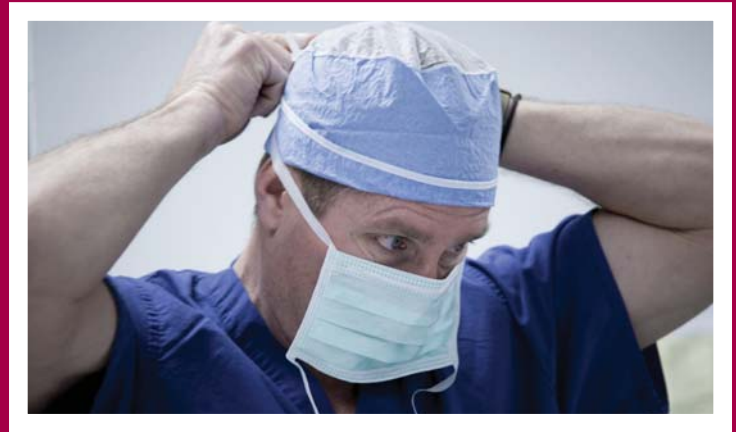

The Royal Geographical Society is located in Kensington on the junction between Exhibition Road and Kensington Gore, the main entrance is on Exhibition Road.

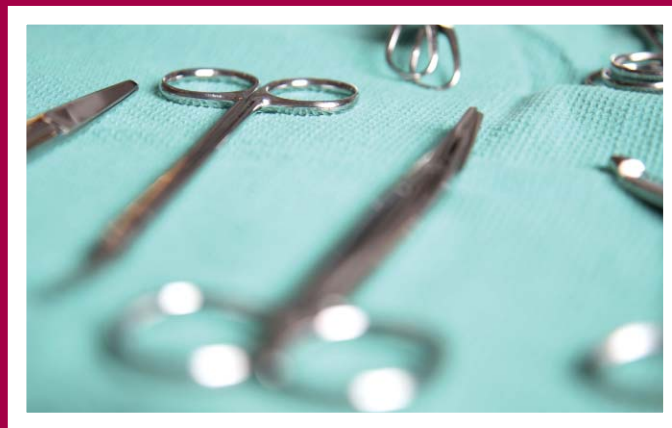


### Address

### Rail

London Paddington & London Victoria are the nearest main line railway stations. Walking from Paddington takes 25 minutes.



### Bus & Underground

Several bus routes stop outside the Society:

- 9 – from Hammersmith to Aldwych
- 10 – from Hammersmith to King's Cross
- 52 – from Willesden to Victoria
- 360 – from Kensington to Elephant & Castle
- 452 – from Wandsworth to Willesden

It is about 10-15 minutes walk from South Kensington tube. South Kensington is on the Circle, District and Piccadilly Lines. Knightsbridge station on the Piccadilly line and Lancaster Gate Station on the Central line are about 15 minutes walk.
